2008 Olympic Games

Report from the Olympic Dressage

A merry band of Yarra Valley members and friends ventured over to Hong Kong for a feast watching the best horses and riders in the world compete for the 2008 Olympic medals.

A section of the Sha Tin racecourse land was converted to house all the Olympic horses, riders, grooms and of course warm up areas and the main competition arena.

Arriving at the venue your ticket was scanned, then you went through security checks, then the ticket was viewed again and the butt ripped off and you were handed a paper and ribbon fan (which certainly came in handy) a plastic poncho in case of rain, a little Olympic flag, plus small cardboard binoculars!

Once inside the venue a loo stop, purchase bottled water and head for the stands. It is still day light but by the time the first competitor starts at 7.15 it is dark. It is still hot and there is hardly any breeze but thank goodness the competitions are run in the evening. The heat and humidity would have been unbearable for the horses and riders during the day time.

We Aussies were well prepared with an Aussie flags, T-shirts and raucous voices chanting Aussie, Aussie, Aussie Oi Oi Oi!!! whenever our riders appeared. Even the English radio commentary made mention on numerous occasions about how supportive we Aussies were of our riders.



The team competition is run over 2 nights. 24 on the first night and 23 on the second night. Night one saw Heath Ryan and Greenoaks Dundee as the 7th rider of the night. He did a really good test, spoilt only by a few balance mistakes on his tempi changes and the passage canter transition. His score was 62.500.

Last ride of the night was Hayley Beresford and Relampago. She did a super test. Her score was 65.583.

The second night saw our third rider Kristy Oatley on Quando Quando do another super test to nudge just past

Hayley on a score of 65.750. The top ride of the night was Isabell Werth and Satchmo who scored 76.417. My personal favourites were Steffen Peters and Ravel and the little grey Russian horse Balagur and Alexandra Korelova. This grey stallion with pink skin glowing on his face and shoulders had the most fabulous, powerful piaffe and passage. His score was 68.625. The evening finished with the medals awarded. Gold to Germany, Silver to the Netherlands and Bronze to Denmark.



The top 25 from the team event advanced into the individual event beginning with the Grand Prix Special.. Kristy finished in 24th place and Hayley on 26th. Imke Schellekens-Bartels horse Sunrise became unsound which meant Hayley got a start. As the first rider on for the evening she did a fantastic test to score 66.320.

Kristy was the 5th rider and Quando Quando looked very flat. Her score was 66.080. A number of horses that night appeared not to have the sparkle they had earlier as if the heat was affecting them. Not so Alexandra and Balagur and Steffen and Ravel who did fabulous tests even though their scores did not really reflect this. Isabell's Satchmo was doing a super test until he spooked going into the piaffe at G and almost left the arena. Despite the upset they scored best on the night with 75.200 to take the lead.



After a rest day the top15 represented for the Kur. My two favourites Balagur and Ravel had scored well enough in the Special to advance. The rest day had done all the horses the world of good as they were all sparkling again. I must say though that some of the riders have the weirdest most boring choices of music, enough to make you doze off losing interest in their choreography. Balagur and Ravel, my favourites did brilliantly but not enough to bring home medals.

Gold to Anky van Grunsven and Salinero, Silver to Isabell Werth and Satchmo and Bronze to Heike Kemmer and Bonaparte.

Report from the Olympic Show Jumping

Ashleigh Drossel Dan at the Hong Kong Olympics

The wonderful exciting Olympic Games: Drossel Dan and Laurie Lever were wonderful and exciting! They exceeded anything that we had expected. Competing in the Teams event Australia was almost a chance for a medal but to qualify for the Individual Final being the last event was really a highlight.

There were three rounds for the Teams event. The first round was also an individual qualifier and was built to give all the horses and riders confidence. Dan and Laurie managed a clear round with just one time fault. Matt Williams on Leconte, Peter McMahon on Genoa and Edwina Alexander on Itot du Chateau all had 4 faults.



The second round was a much bigger course with a huge water jump and difficult related lines. Peter was first to go and claimed 16 faults, as did Dan with an unlucky foot on the tape of the water jump. However Edwina managed a clear round and Matt only had 4 faults, which put the Australian team equal with the Germans and into the Teams Finals the next night. Wow!!



So the Teams Final night came and our first rider Peter McMahon was unlucky enough to have a fall in the warm-up and landed a broken collarbone and a ride in the ambulance. So Australia was left with only three riders. Dan and Laurie came out first and jumped the round of their life with only four faults. Edwina then came in to do a clear round and our medal prospects were looking very good as clear rounds were rare. Matt then came in under a lot of pressure and unfortunately had four rails, which put us out of the medals, but certainly put Australia on the map for a team to be reckoned with in the future.

In the Teams Gold went to USA, Silver to Canada and Bronze to Norway.



So now we have three riders qualified for the Individual jump-off. Whereas previously scores were accumulated from one round to the next, those who qualified for the individual final started with a clean slate. The jumps are now maximum height of 1.60 meter and 2 meters wide, very nerve-wracking for those of us in the stands!!

Dan and Laurie came in to just roll one rail and have another foot on the tape of the water jump to give him eight faults. Edwina came in and had four faults, as did Matt. Only the clear rounds and four faulters jumped in the second round, where Edwina jumped clear and Matt had 16 faults.

There was then lead to a jump off against the clock to decide the medals.

Gold went to Eric Lamaze of Canada riding Hickstead, Silver to Rolf-Goran Bengtsson of Sweden on Ninja and Bronze to Bezie Madden USA on Authentic.



To represent your country Australia and get through the qualifiers and compete on equal terms with the best in the world is not only a tribute to Laurie Lever for his patience and training of Dan but a memory that will stay with us forever.



It was really great to see a number of friends from the Yarra Valley with Rae Ansell and her group including Liz and Kim Wright-Smith and their enthusiastic support, they really added to the colourful, loud, mad experience.

Judy and I loved it and we would like to wish Liz a great experience at the Paralympics with her horse Monty.



Paralympics – Go Grace and Monty!!! Ozzie, ozzie, ozzie, oi, oi, oi!!!



Liz Wright-Smith's dressage horse **Yarra Valley Mount Batton** (Monty to his mates) has left Australia bound for Hong Kong and the Paralympics. Monty is the only Victorian horse on the team and one of five from Australia. Monty will carry 18 year old Grace Bowman from South Australia. In her Olympic tests Grace has to perform shoulder-in, leg yields and also ride a freestyle including medium trot.



We wish them every success for their competitions in the experience of a lifetime!

Nightwatchman and 50 horses drown in Mexico City floods 25th August 2008

A nightwatchman and at least 50 horses drowned after heavy rain flooded an equestrian club in Mexico City, state rescue services said. The 71-year-old nightwatchman drowned at the La Barranca club - near the Mexico State border - as he tried to rescue the horses, state rescue services head Arturo Vilchis told AFP. "A torrent of mud caused by heavy rains was too strong (for him) and he drowned along with between 50 and 60 horses," Mr Vilchis said. 11 horses survived the floods in a corral. In a night of fierce storms, a 13-year-old boy was swept away by a current as he crossed an avenue in Ecatapac in Mexico State, and a man died after being swept away in a stream in north-eastern Zacatecas State, press reports said. **AFP**

From being squashed again.



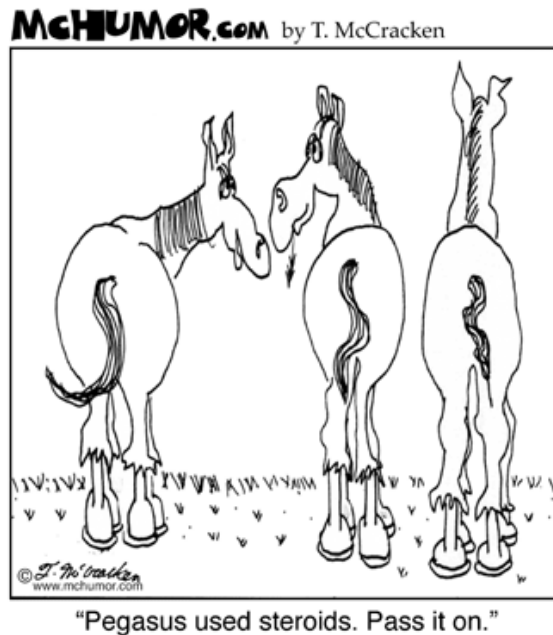
But late at night, when all is still

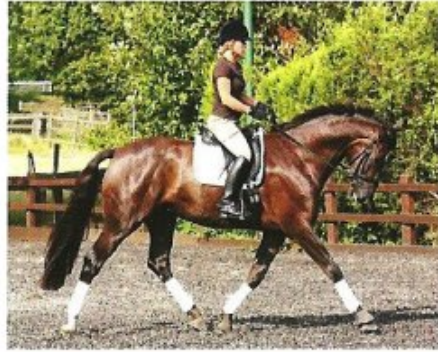

Fundraising Competition at Werribee for The Cancer Council Victoria



"Team Jess" was formed in June 2006. The team is made up of family and friends of a beautiful young girl who lost her battle with cancer in January 2006. Jessica Atwell was only 27 years old and was diagnosed with cancer in November 2005. We had less than 3 months before the disease took her from us. Jess fought to live right up until her last breath and her courage and strength was inspiring to all who were close to her.

One of the hardest things for us to deal with was our sense of helplessness; there was just nothing anyone could do, no amount of money that could have saved her. When some of the family saw the 'Relay for Life' fundraising and awareness campaign being advertised in the local area we decided we would get together and raise some funds for research. We set a goal for our team of \$10,000.....when the word got out we were inundated with people wanting to participate. There were sausage sizzles, breakfasts, raffles and a charity auction was organised. As a result of all the hard work and dedication to the cause, we raised an amazing \$82,423.56.....an Australian record amount!

The 'Team Jess' fundraising juggernaut continued on again in 2007, holding sausage sizzles, fundraising BBQ's, selling chocolates and 'Team Jess' stubby holders and a successful Trivia night. Once again our team had a fantastic result; we raised over \$40,000 for the year.

'Team Jess' has registered to raise funds again in 2008/9 and we've already got planned a Charity Golf day, fundraising BBQ's, sausage sizzles, raffles, chocolate sales, 'Team Jess' pens, a Clover Cottage dinner fundraiser and....

thanks to the very kind generosity of the committee on the Yarra Valley Dressage Club we are running a Dressage Competition in January 2009. 'Team Jess' members will cover lots of the 'legwork' involved with running the competition....but we may need to call on volunteers from YVDC to help with some of the 'horse/dressage' minded tasks such as pencilling on the day!
